From Innovation to Inspiration: Mrs. T. M. Annamma's Journey from Retiree to Coconut Entrepreneur

Background

After retiring from central government service, **Mrs. T. M. Annamma** from Kasaragod wanted to build a purposeful second career that could generate income, create jobs, and promote better utilization of local resources. With a passion for food innovation and marketing, she envisioned a small enterprise that could make coconut-based healthy snacks accessible to the public.

Her search for a reliable, scientific technology led her to reach ICAR–Central Plantation Crops Research Institute (CPCRI), from where she obtained license for Coconut Chips Production Technology in March 2024.

Technology Intervention and Support from CPCRI

Through the technology transfer facilitated by CPCRI's **ITMU and ABI units**, Mrs. Annamma received complete know-how on raw material handling, slicing, drying, and techniques to ensure consistent quality and crispness of the chips. CPCRI also extended hands-on guidance for scaling up, product packaging, and branding support.

She appreciates that **CPCRI remains a constant support system**, providing opportunities for exhibiting and selling her products through the Institute's outlets and events. "CPCRI has become a place I can always return to for guidance," she remarks.

Enterprise Growth and Impact

Mrs. Annamma launched **Bless Farm Flave** in mid-2024 and gradually expanded her operations. The unit now employs **six workers** — **four of them women**, offering regular local employment. Her enterprise records a **profit margin of around 20%**, reflecting the commercial viability of small-scale value addition.

She markets her products through multiple channels — including an **OSOP** (**One Station One Product**) stall at Kasaragod Railway Station, where the products enjoy vibrant sales. Her reach further expanded with online marketing through **Amazon** and other local outlets.

Apart from coconut chips, Mrs. Annamma diversified into developing a **coconut juice** derived from the *Coconut Water Squash Technology* she learned from CPCRI. The product has become popular among health-conscious consumers, particularly at the railway station outlet.

Financial and Institutional Support

To strengthen her enterprise, Mrs. Annamma availed assistance under the PMFME (Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises) scheme, receiving a ₹3 lakh loan and ₹1.33 lakh subsidy. She also secured ₹3.45 lakh grant support from Madhur panchayath.

These financial aids helped her upgrade processing equipment, improve packaging, and expand market outreach.

Challenges and Market Experience

Initially, she faced challenges in establishing consistent **local market acceptance**, as some customers questioned why they should buy processed coconut chips in a coconut-abundant region. However, consumer appreciation for the unique taste, crispness, and hygienic packaging gradually created a loyal customer base - especially for the **spicy flavour**, which emerged as the bestseller.

Innovation and Future Plans

Encouraged by her early success, Mrs. Annamma plans to diversify further by:

- Introducing low-sugar, stevia-based products to meet health-conscious demand.
- Launching **chocolate-flavored coconut chips** for younger audiences.
- Exploring other CPCRI technologies such as **Virgin Coconut Oil (VCO)** and **Coconut Ice Cream** production.

She envisions expanding her product range while maintaining her focus on healthy, locally sourced ingredients.
